Principal Report

Currently the school has 28 students which has allowed for 2 full time class teachers (Bernadette and Katrina) and with additional funding an additional teacher (Danielle) full time and Jamie 3 days per fortnight.

Every school has received an Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction (APCI). Danielle Corcoran was appointed via merit selection and commenced this position on a Wednesday this year.

The school has also been able to employ Danielle for 12 months, one day per week, as a one off, as a Digital Classroom Officer – this is a 12 month funding position from the Rural Access Gap program.

The current literacy groups are broken down into K-2, year 3 and years 5-6 (in the absence of any year 4 students). These sessions are run Monday - Thursday for around half a day. Danielle teaches the 3-6 class the remainder of the day/s while Katrina has Principal release in the office.

There is no major excursion this year – Year 5-6 will go for an overnight camp to Yarrowarra Aboriginal Cultural Centre with the other small schools and the K-3 Students will have a day field trip.

In future years Rebel Sports will not be continuing the Community Kick Back program, which will require more work to create future large-scale raffles.

Dawn the school cleaner for approx. 20 years has taken a position closer to home and no longer works here. Mel is the new replacement and is proving very efficient. The Covid clean continues at the school – unsure of how long this will continue.

The New K-2 literacy curriculum is being rolled out and next year this will occur in Years 3-6, K-2 involves a new style of de-codable reading. New curriculums will be brought out in 2025 for all other KLA subjects.

The school has secured a Bee grant from Bellingen Council, with two new beehives installed at the school and native plants.
