Swimming Scheme

Our annual Swimming Scheme starts in two weeks on Monday 28th November until Friday 2nd December. All students from Kindergarten to Year 6 attend this twoweek program, which Raleigh attends with Orama Public School. The students are broken into small ability groups and taught skills from learning to swim to stroke correction, fitness and survival swimming.

Payment for swimming needs to be paid by next Wednesday 23rd November. The cost is \$60 for the ten days or \$35 if you hold a current pool pass and can produce your membership number.

Students need a pair of swimmers and rash shirt that fit comfortably and which they can jump and dive into the pool with. Students will be unable to swim without a rash shirt or old shirt for sun safety. Students need to travel by private transport and be outside the pool at 9am to start lessons at 9.15am, they are not allowed to enter the pool area without the teachers. Students will then travel back to school by bus to continue lessons for the day.
