Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Last week at Raleigh we had a lovely week learning inside and outside the classroom. Our school photos were taken, and will look a little more traditional due to the rain, but will still look amazing. The rain however was much needed in our gardens and playground and it is fantastic to see our new native plants, that were planted earlier in the year, growing and flowering.

Book Week Celebrations

Last week for Book Week, we had a great day on Wednesday, dressing up as our favourite characters from books we love to read. The students and staff looked terrific in their costumes!



Then in the afternoon, we were able to present each student with the published book that they had helped write and illustrate at the end of Term 3. Two books were produced in each class. The K-2 books were a narrative story based on the 'animals' we have in our school, one was about Bessie the cow and the other about our bees. In 3-6 both books were reflection pieces about 2020 and the year that we have had so far and some of the crazy things that have happened. Hopefully these books will be kept as a treasured memory. We also purchased an additional copy for the school library, so they will be able to be borrowed and shared at home. The publishing was made possible due to a program we applied for with Little Scribe, a Sydney based company who has devoted itself to inspiring young writers. We were lucky to be accepted into their program, which allowed us to receive a free published book for each of our students. Next year we hope to be involved in the program again, but will probably need to pay for the books. After sending the books home last week, we received lots of positive feedback from parents and families about how special these books were. Thanks to everyone for your positive comments! 


World Teacher Day

Aussie Backyard Bird Count

Last week our students broke into four smaller groups and went outside to see what types of birds we have in our school community. The students really enjoyed trying to identify the different species and then recognising them again the next day or at recess and lunch. We saw a variety of birds including: kookaburras, willy-wag tails, cattle egrets, ibis, rainbow lorikeets, magpies, magpie lark (pee-wee), peregrine falcon, blue-faced honeyeater, crows and unfortunately Indian minors. This was a lovely peaceful and mindful activity that would be nice to do on the weekend.



Science in Term 4

Last Thursday, the K-2 class had a go of the Bee Bots and Blue Bot as a part of their Programming Unit in Science.



The 3-6 class are exploring and learning about 'Light' and last week investigated light travelling through opaque, transparent and translucent materials.

Term 4 K-2D

This term in K-2D we are working well in all of our learning. In English we are reading books that feature Australian animals and often the stories are a retell based on old fairy tales, such as Henny Penny or the Boy Who Cried Wolf. We are working on alternative sounds in spelling as well as practising sight words and continuing to read in our groups.



In Maths we are building on our understanding of number and mathematical operations, such as addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Our class has lots of hands on activities and games to consolidate these skills. Our Geography topic, is Australian Places and we are looking at our address, parts of Australia on a map and interesting place names, along with places to visit. In Science and Technology we are investigating digital technology and programming using the Bee-Bots. This is a fun and interactive way for the students to learn coding.

Our homework is reading each night and the Year 2 students are encouraged to work on their fast maths, fluency skills by practising Reflex maths.

We have developed some great skills, skipping in K-2 and are really enjoying tennis on Thursdays.

If your child will be going into Year 3 or Year 7 next year, you will need to apply for a new bus pass. You can go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.
