Dear Parents and Caregivers,

This week there have been some new guidelines introduced in schools. These become mandatory from tomorrow 19th August.

In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded **NOT** to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. Schools will make arrangements for students who present as unwell or have flu like symptoms to be sent home.

COVID-19 symptoms can include:

fever sore throat cough shortness of breath.

If your child is sick, keep them at home and get them tested for COVID-19.

NSW Health have requested that schools encourage anyone who is unwell or has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics.

Students and staff with flu like symptoms will need to provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result before being permitted to return to school.

We are continuing to implement ongoing personal hygiene processes inside and outside the classroom.

3-6 History

On the days when I am teaching the 3-6 class, we have been focussing on learning about early colonisation. We have been and will be exploring the spread of the British settlement as they moved out of Sydney, the effect this had on Aboriginal people, the Gold Rush, the impact of the railway and the telegraph. We have also been reading a novel called The Hunt for Ned Kelly. The book and the topic have created some excitement around learning things about Australia's history.

The 3-6 students have been given a homework task to research and present a speech to the class about a bushranger they find interesting. They will be presenting their speeches to the class in Week 9. It is important for them to remember to look at the task as a way of sharing what they find interesting about their bushranger. Every child in the class talks daily in front of the others and they should think of it as being very similar to this. I cannot wait to find out new and interesting facts about the bushrangers they choose.

STEM this Friday

Last Friday our buddies got together to plan their STEM project for this week. The students have designed a kite and created a list of equipment they will need to make it. Every child is expected to help out and bring in what they will need from home to make their kite, this Friday. Let's hope for a lovely sunny day with a light breeze!
