#### Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Thank you to all of our families for supporting the guidelines and being understanding of the current COVID-19 guidelines in schools. #### **Life Education Visit**

Last Wednesday, Lee and Healthy Harold joined us at Raleigh to conduct our biennial Life Education Program. It was a little bit different this year without the Life Education Van, with our lessons being run in the classrooms. The students from both classes really enjoyed their lesson and were able to discuss what they had learnt with their class afterwards. The K-2 students learnt about body workings, peer pressure and coping strategies, safety and decision making. The 3-6 class learnt more about being Cyber-Wise through relevant scenarios.

#### **Our Kitchen Garden**

Last Wednesday afternoon I attended an online Zoom meeting after school. This meeting was part of the Live Life Well@ School Initiative to create a network of schools to discuss our Kitchen Garden programs. We were able to share ideas, look at a study done by Newcastle University on kitchen gardens and look at ways we can continue our program in the current COVID climate.

As everyone is aware Jimmy has built our chicken's a new Chook House, which they are very happy in and love! Jimmy has now started to pull down the fence and netting around our current Veggie Patch. We will then be replacing the fence and netting, topping up the garden beds and replanting. We hope we will be able to use the vegetables in KiK, sometime in Term 4.

## Father's Day Stall

This year we will be holding our Annual Father's Day Stall, however it will be a little bit different to previous years. Students can bring in \$4 to purchase a gift for Dad, Grandad, Pop or even for Mum, if she is your special person at home. Students are able to purchase more than one gift, but will not be able to choose their second or subsequent gifts until everyone chooses their first. All money MUST be at school by Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> September, we will not be accepting late money. It is preferred that this money is paid online via POP to reduce the handling of coins.



At the stall, the gifts will be placed on display for students to look at and choose, using extra hygiene procedures by staff. Students will not be touching gifts when they are choosing. The child will then take their gift and place it in their bag, to take home and store safely for Father's Day on Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> September.
