Getting to school by bus in 2024

Will your child be catching the bus to school next year? Applications are now open for a Bus Travel Pass. As it's a busy time of year, we highly recommend you make this application before the end of the year. It's also good to check the bus timetable to make your child's journey to school as easy as possible. Here is how it works:

Bus passes

- All students catching the bus in 2024 will need a school travel pass.
- Under the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS), eligible students can apply for free or subsided travel between home and school.
- For more information about the School Student Transport Scheme and how to apply for a school travel pass, visit https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/ from a desktop computer.

Bus timetables

Busways is the school bus operator that runs your schools' bus services. To find your child's school bus timetable visit the Busways website by using the following steps:

- 1. Go to <u>busways.com.au/nsw</u>
- 2. Click on 'school services' in the navigation bar and then proceed to 'school timetables'
- 3. Enter the school's name in the field that says 'enter a school name'
- 4. Select the school's name and the timetable should open on your device. If you are unable to find or search for the school's name, use the drop-down menus on the same web page to find the school.
- 5. Once the timetable is opened, you will be able to identify which school bus services are available in your area for your child to use.

Kids in the Kitchen Recipes

Creamy Pasta Salad Ingredients

250g pasta uncooked
1 medium carrot, grated
1 celery stick chopped
1 spring onion finely chopped, green parts only
½ red capsicum diced
2/3 cup tasty cheese grated
1/3 cup parsley, finely chopped
300ml coleslaw dressing
3 tbs sour cream, heaped



Method

Cook pasta in boiling, salted water, then drain and chill.

In a small bowl, combine the coleslaw dressing and sour cream.

Combine pasta, vegetables, cheese and coleslaw dressing mixture.

Season. Chill before serving.

Quinoa Salad

Ingredients

1 cup uncooked quinoa, rinsed in a fine mesh colander

2 cups water

1 can chickpeas, rinsed and drained, or 1 ½ cup cooked chickpeas

1 medium cucumber, seeded and chopped

1 medium red capsicum, chopped

3/4 cup chopped red onion

1 cup finely chopped flat-leafed parsley

½ cup olive oil

1/4 cup lemon juice

1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar

2 cloves garlic, pressed or mince

½ teaspoon fine sea salt

Freshly ground black pepper



Method

To cook quinoa: Combine the rinsed quinoa and water in a medium saucepan. Bring the mixture to boil over a medium-high heat, then decrease the heat to maintain a gentle simmer. Cook until the quinoa has absorbed all the water, about 15 minutes, reducing heat as time goes on to maintain a gentle simmer. Remove from heat, cover and let the quinoa rest for 5 minutes, to give it time to fluff up.

In a large serving bowl, combine the chickpeas, cucumber, bell pepper, onion and parsley. Set aside.

In a small bowl, combine the olive oil, lemon juice, vinegar, garlic and salt. Whisk until blended then set aside.

Once the quinoa is mostly cool, add it to the serving bowl and drizzle the dressing on top. Top until the mixture is thoroughly combined. Season with black pepper to taste and add an extra pinch of salt if needed. Let the salad rest for 5 to 10 minutes before serving.

5 Ingredient Super Simple Potato Salad

Ingredients

800 grams Desiree or other red skinned potatoes, chopped into bite size pieces

1 cup of GF mayonnaise

3 tbsps chopped parsley

3 rashers of bacon, chopped into thin slivers

4 spring onions, thinly chopped

Method

Steam the potatoes until bite through.

Drain. Cool rapidly by covering in cold water. When the water warms, replace it with cold water until the water stays cold.

Meanwhile, fry the bacon until crispy.

Add the bacon, mayonnaise, parsley and spring onion to the potatoes and mix until well combined.

Refrigerate until serving.

Strawberry Jelly Slice

Ingredients

3/4 cup self-raising flour
1/3 cup shredded coconut
85g strawberry Aeroplane jelly
1 ½ cups boiling water
1/3 cup brown sugar
90g butter (melted)
2 tsp gelatine powder
250g fresh strawberries (chopped)



Method

Line a lamington tin with baking paper to cover base and extend over each side.

Combine sifted flour, sugar and coconut in a large bowl.

Add melted butter and mix together.

Press mixture into base of prepared tin.

Make the topping by combining gelatine and jelly crystals, the add boiling water. Stir until dissolved.

Cool the topping in the refrigerator until thick and syrupy, then fold in the strawberries.

Pour topping over cooled base and refrigerate until set.


Cut evenly into squares and serve with extra strawberries and whipped cream.
